

HOW TO DO YOUR FINGERPRINTS

Watch the How To Do Your Fingerprints at Home YouTube video Review this document before starting your fingerprints.



1. Wash your hands prior to taking your fingerprints.



2. Each fingerprint is labeled in the bottom left corner of each block.



3. Do one fingerprint at a time starting with your right thumb.



4. Roll your thumb across the ink pad from left to right.



7. The bottom row is for simultaneous impressions of all fingers and thumbs.



5. Roll your thumbprint while pressing moderately on the assigned block.



6. Repeat steps 5-8 with each finger and thumb on both hands



9. Press straight down for these impressions, don't roll your fingers or thumbs.

Deformed or missing fingers: If the finger is deformed, every attempt should be made to record the fingerprint in both the rolled and plain impression blocks. Missing fingers should be designated via a notation in the fingerprint block (e.g. amp, missing at birth, severed). Tip-amputated fingers and scarred fingers should be recorded in both the rolled and plain impression blocks when possible.

8. Re-ink all fingers for the

simultaneous impression

followed by the thumbs.

Refer to the completed application card example on the reverse side.

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HOW TO: Complete Your Fingerprint Cards

Read the instructions carefully before you start. Your kit includes two (2) FD-258 cards to be completed and returned to our office for processing. We encourage you to practice on a piece of plain paper before you begin.

As stated at the top of the fingerprint card **PRINT ALL INFORMATION IN BLACK INK.**
